

## SHAREHOLDER PRIVACY NOTICE

---

This privacy notice applies to you if you are an individual and are a current or former registered shareholder of AstraZeneca PLC and describes what personal information we collect, how that information is used and what your rights are in relation to that information.

In this privacy notice “AstraZeneca”, “we”, “us” and “our” refer to AstraZeneca PLC and [AstraZeneca Group companies](#). The registered office of AstraZeneca PLC is 1 Francis Crick Avenue, Cambridge Biomedical Campus, Cambridge, CB2 0AA, United Kingdom and contact details in relation to this privacy notice are provided below.

AstraZeneca takes the privacy and security of your personal information very seriously. We determine the purposes and manner in which your personal information is collected, used and/or disclosed and managed in line with AstraZeneca’s [internal global privacy standards](#).

We process personal information, which includes:

- Name
- Address
- Contact details
- Bank account details
- Details of shares held
- Shareholder reference number
- Voting instructions
- Corporate action elections
- Date of death
- Voice and / or image

This information is processed so that we can:

- Manage your shareholding in AstraZeneca PLC and keep your record on the shareholder register up-to-date;
- Make shareholder communications and shareholder meeting materials available to you, such as the Annual Report and Form 20-F Information and the Notice of Annual General Meeting;
- Pay dividends to you;
- Allow you to exercise your rights as a shareholder, such as the right to vote at shareholder meetings, including digitally-enabled meetings; and
- Respond to any correspondence you send to us.

We have engaged Computershare Investor Services PLC as our ordinary share registrar. Computershare Investor Services PLC and other Computershare Group entities (“Computershare”) maintain the AstraZeneca PLC shareholder register and process shareholders’ personal information on our behalf.

Your personal information is collected when you provide it to us, to Computershare or to other third parties engaged to carry out services on our behalf, for example when you provide

information in writing or provide your details via Computershare website. Your information is also collected when you exercise rights attached to your shares, such as voting. Your information might also be provided to us or to Computershare by third parties, for example by an agent through which you trade in AstraZeneca shares. Your voice or image may be captured and recorded, for example within a recording of a shareholder meeting which you attend either virtually or in person.

The information is processed to allow us to comply with our legal obligations or to allow us to fulfil contractual obligations with shareholders or where we have a legitimate interest to process the information so that we are able to communicate effectively with shareholders.

It is important that you notify us of any changes to your personal details (such as a change of address) so that your record on the shareholder register can be kept up-to-date.

The entities with whom we share personal data may be located in different jurisdictions globally. When we transfer your personal data across borders, we do so in compliance with applicable privacy and data protection laws.

Where required by law, we rely on contracts to ensure that the entity receiving your personal data complies with applicable data protection laws. Such contractual arrangements include, for example, AstraZeneca's [Binding Corporate Rules](#) and Standard Contract Clauses, or equivalent instruments approved by a competent supervisory authority. Law enforcement, regulatory and security authorities or courts in the jurisdictions to which we transfer your personal data may have a right to access your personal data in accordance with applicable laws.

Your personal information will be kept for as long as is reasonably required to achieve the purposes for which it was collected. Your record on the shareholder register will be maintained while you are a shareholder of AstraZeneca. If you cease to hold AstraZeneca shares, your information will be kept for a period of up to 12 years following the last update to your record on the shareholder register, or for as long as is necessary to resolve any outstanding matters relating to your shareholding or to meet legal, regulatory or tax requirements.

Generally, your rights in relation to your personal data will depend on: (i) the data protection law that applies to how we collect and use your personal data; and (ii) the lawful basis on which we collect and use your personal data. Some laws also apply conditions or exceptions to the exercise of these rights.

You may have the following rights in relation to your personal data:

- Right to obtain information on how we use your personal data, including the purposes for which we use it, with whom we share it, how long we retain it, and so forth;
- Right to access to the personal data we hold about you, including receive a copy of your personal data;
- Right to have us correct any inaccuracies in the personal data we hold about you (for example, because it is incomplete or out of date);
- Right to have us delete (erase) your personal data;
- Right to have us transmit the personal data you have provided to us about yourself to a third party;

- Right to object to our use of your personal data (for example, for direct marketing); and
- Any other right recognized by applicable data protection law.

If you want to exercise these rights, please use AstraZeneca's dedicated [online platform](#). When doing so, please note the following:

- We may ask you to provide proof that you are who you say you are if we have any doubts about your identity. For example, we may ask you to verify certain data we have about you or, in some cases, to show us your ID.
- If you are making the request on behalf of someone else, we may ask you to provide proof that you have been authorized by that other person to make the request on their behalf.
- We will delete any proof of your identity as soon as we are satisfied that you are who you say you are, or that you are in fact representing someone else.

In addition to the above rights, you may also have the right to complain to your local data protection authority, depending on the applicable law.
